

Hydrophyllaceae (Waterleaf Family)

Phenology: flowering/fruiting period, April to May.

Management Responsibility: BLM (AZ Strip Field Office, Kingman Field Office), NPS (Grand Canyon NP), private (historical record).

Notes: Monotypic genus, distinguished by its strongly dimorphic calyx. Occasional, but inconspicuous, often growing under shrubs.



Habitat: in Arizona, growing on gravelly slopes and sandy loam flats in Joshua tree woodland and creosote bush scrub, 2,000-3,500 ft (610-1065 m) elevation.



Range: few, widely scattered localities in Mohave County; main range in Nevada and California.
